

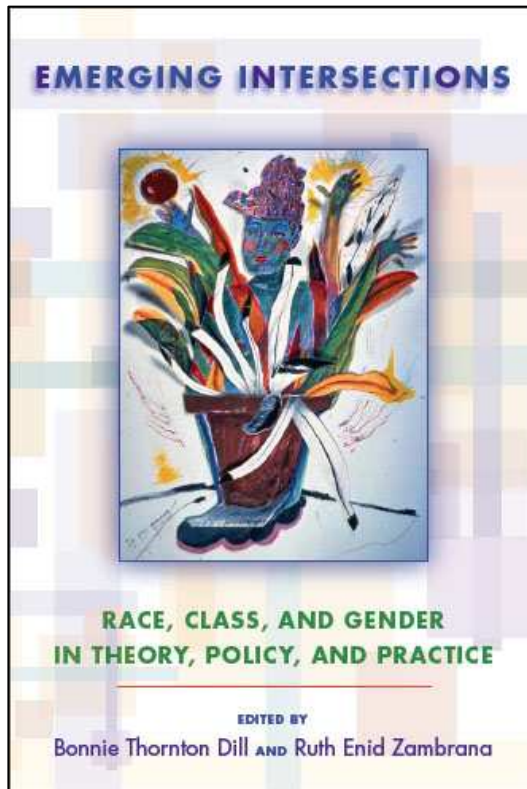

The Consortium on Race, Gender and Ethnicity is pleased to present an Intersectional Policy Conference in concurrence with a book signing for *Emerging Intersections: Race, Class and Gender in Theory, Policy and Practice* (Rutgers University Press, 2009), on Thursday, April 2nd from 9:00am-3:00pm in the Colony Ballroom in Stamp Student Union. Edited by Dr. Bonnie Thornton Dill and Dr. Ruth E. Zambrana, the book showcases innovative contributions that expand our understanding of how inequality affects people of color, demonstrates the ways public policies reinforce existing systems of inequality, and shows how research and teaching using an intersectional perspective compels scholars to become agents of change within institutions. The book and panel will serve as an important resource on equity and diversity at the University of Maryland, College Park campus.

The panel composed of the authors will present two main interest areas of diversity. The first panel of the conference will examine *Implications for Public Policy* and the second panel will present *Inequalities in the Intersections of Race, Gender, Ethnicity and Class*. Instrumental to issues of diversity and equity, this conference will have the opportunity to look at the problems of inequality and oppression from new angles and promote intersectionality as an interpretive tool that can be utilized to better understand the ways in which race, class, gender, ethnicity and other dimensions of diversity shape our lives today. The panel presentation will be concluded with a book signing by the editors and authors. **Registration is free for this event.**
